GLOBAL INITIATIVES

Four study abroad students completed credit courses at Robert Gordon University in Aberdeen, Scotland.

For the second year, a CGTC student received the Benjamin A. Gilman scholarship, a national award for study abroad students.

CGTC signed an articulation agreement with York St. John University in York, England, the College's study abroad site for July 2018.

CGTC's partnership with the University of Massachusetts and Kabul Polytechnic University resulted in the first cohort of Information Technology graduates in Afghanistan through this initiative.

CGTC FOUNDATION
